Horsechestnut, Common, European Horsechestnut

Aesculus hippocastanum

- Large, deciduous Commonly 50' to 75' tall,
- Upright-oval to rounded form, lower branches hang down
- Avoid hot, dry locations
- Needs room to develop
- Leaves are light green and turn dark green at maturity, 4"- 10" long
- Dull yellow, brown in autumn
- Young leaves , fruit are considered poisonous
- Showy white flowers peak in mid-May
- Blotch of yellow and red color at the base
- Nut 2" to 2.5" diameter capsules, spiny husk
- Light brown in color
- Matures in Sept.,Oct.
- Kids love to collect them
